

RULES RELATING TO THE SUBJECTS AND STANDARDS OF THE COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR THE POST OF SIKKIM STATE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. (1) The examination shall include compulsory and optional subjects and every candidate shall take all the compulsory subjects and two of the optional subjects.

(2) A candidate shall specify in his application form the optional subjects he desires to take, but may intimate any change of intention to the Secretary, Sikkim Public Service Commission not later than the date prescribed for the payment of the examination fee.

2. A candidate shall answer the papers in English only except the regional languages.

3. No candidate shall be considered to have qualified the written examination unless he obtains at least 45% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects.

Provided that the number of candidates to be called for the viva-voce test after a particular written examination shall be determined by the Sikkim Public Service Commission at its discretion, and that this number shall, as far as possible be restricted five times the number of vacancies notified for recruitment through that examination.

4. The compulsory and optional subjects and maximum marks fixed for each subject shall be as shown in the statement below :-

14. Tourism, Hotel Management and Geography,
15. Home Science, Hotel Management & Physical Education,
16. Social Work, Psychology & Education,
17. Bio Technology with any of the subjects viz Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Chemistry, Forestry, Botany, Zoology,
18. Any Engineering subjects with any of the Engineering courses

The standards and contents of papers in general, shall be similar to those of Degree level, i.e. B.A. or B.Sc. etc. Examination of a recognized Indian University.
